This phone booth greenhouse was made at SponCon 2012 by the team from Adapt Design + Build. Modeled after a classic phone booth design, it features reclaimed fir, tempered glass shower panels, a clear UVresistant corrugated vinyl roof, coated wire shelves, a light, and finials on the top corners. Measures 42" x 42" x 87".


This plumbing lamp was made at Spontaneous Construction 2012 by the team from Blackfoot Native Plants, and it features switches made from spigots and toilet fushers! The weight of a polished rusted iron base and lots of iron pipe keep the lamp in place while the flexible shafts can be bent to point the light where you need it. 34" tall.

This painting was masterfully execułed by illustrious local illustrator Josh Quick, at the Paint-A-Door station at Spontaneous Construction. Josh was one of our celebrity judges for the event, but thankfully he was able to dash away from his duties to paint this wonderful self-portrait of himself riding his bike.


These lamps were constructed at SponCon2012 by Acton Douglas and Susie Reahard. Built from old drill-press bases, small radiator shields, and weathered electrical boxes, they don't look like lamps until you turn them on, at which point they beam an ambiance of industrial warmth.


This Pine and granite table was constructed at SponCon 2012 by the team from the Helena Woodworkers' Guild. They selected wood rich in character from the Home ReSource yard and constructed this shelf using hand-carved mortise and tenons and antique square nails. Measures $35^{\prime \prime}$ wide, $11^{\prime \prime}$ front to back, and $37.5^{\prime \prime}$ tall.

This table was constructed at SponCon2012 by Tyson Miller and friends. Built from Siberian Elm locally harvested by Bad Goat Forest Products, this table is held together using old-world joinery, without the use of screws, nails, or bolts. It is finished with handrubbed linseed oil. Measures $7^{\prime}$ long, $32^{\prime \prime}$ wide, and $35^{\prime \prime}$ tall.

This outdoor sleeping shelter was built at SponCon 2012 by the team from MUD. It's called Star Nap, and it'll keep the bugs off you while you're sleeping outside on those warm, starry summer nights. And if you don'ł like sleeping outside, it doubles as a chicken tractor!


This solid walnut piezoelectric guitar was built in the ReVAMP shop by Home ReSource Outreach Coordintor Abe Coley. Designed solely with functionality in mind, the ends of the strings pass through the body and are anchored directly into the wood, creating a tremendous resonance that is captured by a piezoelectric pickup embedded under the bridge. A conspicuous lack of switches, knobs, and visible pickups create an elegant simplicity, and a short $23^{\prime \prime}$ scale makes it easy to play for kids and people with small hands.
