PLEASE JOIN US! You and your fifth grade class are invited to participate in ZWAP!, our Zero Waste Ambassadors Program to knock out waste in Missoula. This educational adventure is the newest initiative of the Home ReSource Education Program, which seeks to increase waste reduction awareness, knowledge, and skills, and to celebrate reuse.
ZWAP! is designed to help young Missoulians begin to think more critically about materials – where they come from and where they go – and to empower them with the knowledge that their choices really do matter.



The Goal of ZWAP!

The goal of our Zero Waste Ambassadors Program is for students to take away three key messages:

- 1. We have a CHOICE! Waste isn't waste until it's wasted.
- 2. There are a lot of ACTIONS to reduce waste! Reduce, Reuse, Recycle + Refuse, Rethink, Request, etc..
- 3. We can make a DIFFERENCE by reducing waste every day! Choice + Action = Difference

The Outcomes of ZWAP!

Our Zero Waste Ambassadors Program aims to help students become:

- 1. ENGAGED in problem solving around waste
- 2. EMPOWERED with the skills and knowledge to be Zero Waste Ambassadors
- 3. INSPIRED to knock out waste in Missoula

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The Structure of ZWAP!

We offer ZWAP! at no cost to teachers, schools, or students.

ZWAP! is implemented in two parts:

- A Home ReSource educator visits the class and facilitates a lively, interactive guided discussion about the Materials Economy and the global impacts associated with it.
- 2. In the following weeks, the class takes one field trip to Home **ReSource** (Home ReSource will provide transportation) where students review the Materials Economy through an interactive game and engage in several hands-on learning activities.
- 3. Bonus Activities! We have developed several activities including a Trash Tracker waste audit, a Request activity, and a Redesign activity that we encourage your class to engage in during the time between the two sessions.

The Learning Objectives of ZWAP!

- 1. Increase understanding of waste and how to reduce it
- 2. Increase ability to evaluate and problem solve around real-world problems

The ZWAP! Theory of Change

As students become knowledgeable about waste, increase their understanding of how to reduce it, and feel empowered that individuals' choices and actions can make a big difference, they will share their knowledge with peers and adults, evaluate where waste happens in their lives, and choose to make changes to move toward a Zero Waste lifestyle. If this transformation takes place in a school district that is actively pursuing a Zero Waste goal, the likelihood of lasting behavior change will increase.
